**THE PROGRAM...** The program begins with an **overnight retreat** near Salina, and includes seven additional full-day sessions, one every two weeks. Each session will include a new leadership skill, a discussion with community leaders, and a community tour. The final session will include a **celebration** of class accomplishments.

**THE PARTICIPANTS...**

A diversified group of up to 30 participants will be selected from various business, professional, governmental, educational, religious, civic and minority organizations. Leadership Salina does not discriminate in its enrollment policies on the basis of race, sex or religion. **Participants must agree to attend all sessions and accept responsibility for tuition payment.**

**THE FEES...** Tuition for the Leadership Salina program is **\$450 per person**, which includes all materials, meals, and social functions. Tuition can be paid by a business or organization for a participant, or an individual can pay his or her own tuition. **A limited number of partial scholarships are available.**

**THE CURRICULUM...**

**COMMUNITY EXPOSURE**

Leaders need a good understanding of their community. In each session, class members will be exposed to a segment of the community by **listening** to and **conversing** with a panel of community experts and **participating** in community tours. Each class session will be held at a different venue. Session topics include: **Social Services; Education; City/County Government; Health Care; Economic Base/Business; Tourism; and Arts and Culture.**

**GROUP PROJECTS**

Class members will have the **opportunity** to use their leadership skills for the direct betterment of the community through a **group project** or projects, based on their vision for the community. Group members will be responsible for researching their idea(s), determining feasibility, acquiring resources to complete the project, completing the project, and **celebrating their accomplishments.**

**LEADERSHIP SKILLS**

Skills needed to lead effectively today are different than in the past. Leaders today must understand the value of collaboration and possess the ability to facilitate. Leadership Salina class members will learn: **Learning Styles, Steps to a Performing Community, Wisdom Cycle, Consensus and Collaboration, Ethical Decision Making, Vision Process, Facilitation Techniques, Creative Thinking, Listening, Storytelling, Peer Consultation and Servant Leadership.**
