ELIGIBILITY

How do I know what scholarships I qualify for?

Take our eligibility assessment here. All criteria can be found under the "Scholarships" page and "Scholarship Fund & Criteria" drop down menu.

Do I have to submit my FASFA?

Not unless specifically requested. However, some scholarships are awarded based on financial need and will require your Student Aid Report to view your Expected Family Contribution and make a decision on your eligibility.

Do I need to wait until I am accepted for admission to be eligible to apply for scholarships?

Not unless specifically requested. However, you must be admitted and enrolled to an accredited college or university before the community foundation will disperse your award.

APPLYING

How do I apply for scholarships?

First time applicants should click the "Take the Assessment" button under the scholarships tab. If you are a returning user, click the "Login Here" button under the scholarship tab.

What is the link to access the application portal? gscf.org/scholarshipapplication

How do I know if my application went through?

You will receive a confirmation sent to the email associated with your login every time an application is submitted.

Can I apply for more than one scholarship?

Yes. You are encouraged to apply for all scholarships you meet the eligibility requirements.

When are applications open?

Scholarship applications open November 1 and are due the following February 15.

Does my transcript have to be official?

No. Transcripts will be accepted in official or unofficial format. The only requirement is that they are uploaded to the online system in an acceptable file format.

RECEIVING

When will I know if I received a scholarship?

Applications are reviewed between February 25 and March 15. You will be notified of the committee's decision in April or May, depending on what you have applied for.

How do I claim my scholarship?

To claim your scholarship, login to your scholarship portal. This can be done by clicking "Login Here" on the "Scholarships" page. Follow up forms will need to be completed for each of the scholarships you have been awarded: scholarship acceptance form, thank you note, and photo. <u>Visit the resource library for examples.</u>

GLOSSARY

FAFSA

FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. This can be found at <u>studentaid.gov.</u>

SARS

SARS is a Student Aid Report that can be found within your FAFSA account. This is the document the foundation will need you to upload to your scholarship application. It would have been emailed to your after you completed your FAFSA. It can also be found under the "You Can Also" section of your personal FAFSA account. Questions about the FAFSA/SARS should be directed towards the Federal Student Aid help center.

TIPS



1. REQUESTING LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

- Scholarship applications may require a letter of recommendation. Some might ask for it to be written by a specific member of the community and others may be up to the applicant's discretion.
 - Whom to ask? A letter of recommendation should be written by an individual that can speak to your strengths and ability to overcome challenges- someone that knows you well.
 - Teachers, counselors, employers, church leaders, and club advisors often fall into this category.
 - Applicants are unable to request recommendations from individuals who are part
 of the scholarship selection committee you are applying for.
 - How to ask? To request a letter of recommendation within your application, you will
 enter the recommender's email in the designated space titled 'Third Party Email.'
 Then, you will compose a personal request email. Although not required by GSCF, it is
 courteous to make your recommender aware that you have chosen them for this role,
 so that they can accept and be on the lookout for an email from the Foundation.
 - When to ask? It is standard to give your recommender a two-week notice, so they have ample time to write the letter. Make sure to follow-up with them periodically to assure that your letter is being worked on and submitted.

2. MEET ALL APPLICATION DEADLINES

- Scholarship applications will close after the assigned deadline date. Any information or applications not submitted are unable to be considered.
- Use a calendar or planner to schedule deadlines and mark dates in which you would like to request letters of recommendation by.



3. DO NOT IGNORE SMALL AWARDS

• There are tons of scholarships to apply for. After completing the eligibility quiz, you will be able to see which scholarship funds align closest with your qualifications. Do not ignore funds that tend to be given in smaller amounts- awards add up! Additionally, higher award amounts tend to increase the pool of competition.



4. DRAFT AND PROOF ESSAYS

- Many scholarships require short answer or essay responses.
- Drafting: It is helpful to draft responses as documents that are able to be saved to your
 computer or drive. If you are applying for multiple scholarships, prompts may be similar,
 and essays can be tailored to a variety of applications.
- Proofing: Check for clarity and grammatical errors by asking a trusted peer, family member,
 or teacher to review your essay. Make sure to do your own writing, but the editing process
 can be benefited with a fresh pair of eyes.



Present what you are passionate about in a focused, thoughtful, and organized manner.
 Write naturally and support your ideas with specific examples. The selection committee would like to see what makes you you!



6. USE A PERSONAL EMAIL

Use a personal email not provided to you through work or school for your account. If your
employment or enrollment at that institution ends, it will be difficult to know whether or
not you were awarded a scholarship or access your account.



7. DOUBLE CHECK REQUIREMENTS

 Give your application a glance before submitting to make sure you have included everything necessary and preview any uploaded documents for accuracy.



8. KEEP YOUR RESUME UPDATED

 To accurately communicate your experiences and involvement to review committees, update your resumes often. We recommend to keep your resume one to two pages in length to provide a concise report.

- What should I include on my resume? If you are stuck and not sure what to include on your resume, here are some potential ideas:
 - contact information
 - o career goals
 - o education/academic experience
 - o awards and honors
 - o societies and clubs
 - o work/internship experience
 - o school involvement
 - o community involvement
 - o volunteer experience
 - o athletic achievements
 - o languages
 - o skills or special interests
 - o church activities

REQUEST LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

Within some applications, you will be required to request a letter of recommendation. After entering the recommender's email address in the "Third Party Email" field, applicants should click the "Compose Email" button. Composing an email within your application will send a personal email formally requesting the individual to be your reference. Below is an example. 
Dear Coach Smith,

What internet browser should I use?

Google Chrome 14 or higher or Safari 4 or higher. Other browsers, as well as Safari 5.1x, may cause technical issues. You should revert to Safari 5.0 or upgrade to Safari 6.



What do I do if I forgot my password?

Click the "Forgot your Password?" button underneath the login fields. From there, you will be prompted to enter your email. A recovery email will be sent to that address.



How do I create an account?

Click the "Create New Account" button underneath the login fields. You will be prompted to fill out your information and create a password.



Why did my work not save?

Save your work frequently using the "save" button at the bottom of the page. If your progress gets losts, most likely your internet connection was lost. Check your connection and log back in to see if your browser cache saved your work.



How do I find the applications I'm working on?

After logging into the scholarship portal, you will be taken to the homepage. There, is a tab titled "Active Requests" where you will be able to see all of your live applications.



Can I see my past applications?

After logging into the scholarship portal, you will be taken to the homepage. There, is a tab titled "Historical Requests" where you will be able to see all of your old applications.



How do I update my contact information?

Login to the applicant portal system. To update your information, click on your name in the upper right hand corner. You can then click the "Edit My Profile" option.



How do I reset my username?

Your username is an email address. If you have forgotten your username, please email grants@gscf.org or call 785-823-1800.



Is there a spell check feature?

Yes. The system will check for misspelled words but will not check for grammatical mistakes.



What file formats will be accepted for attachments?

We prefer that you attach files in a PDF format (.pdf). We will also accept files in Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) or Excel (.xls or .xlsx). Unacceptable formats include files with the "exe", "com", "vbs", and "bat" extensions.



Why am I having problems uploading files?

Double check that there are no symbols in the file name, the file type and size are OK, then try one or more of these suggestions:

- Sometimes the problem can be a corrupt file. Try saving a new, renamed version of the document.
- Try saving your file as a different type. For instance, if you tried to upload a (.pdf) file, try uploading the original Word or Excel version of this document. If it is a Word (.doc or .docx) or Excel (.xls or .xlsx) document, try saving it as a (.pdf) file and then uploading that version. If you scanned a document to create a (.jpg) file, convert it to a (.pdf) format instead.
- Use a different computer to do the upload.
